

AN ABORTED CHILD

Laura Dieckman: Sea Organisation: Joined in 1991: Left in 2004: Abortion in 1996.

Laura was just 12 when her parents let her leave home to work full time for Scientology's religious order, the Sea Organisation. At 16, she married a co-worker. At 17, she was pregnant. She was excited to start a family, but she said Sea Organisation supervisors pressured her to have an abortion. She was back at work the following day. "It became like I didn't have a choice anymore. I didn't know how extensive the pressure or coercion would be. I knew there were people who had gotten abortions. But I didn't know how much pressure there was. I hadn't seen it first hand, at that point."

Claire Headley: Sea Organisation: Joined in 1991: Left in 2005: Abortions in 1994 and 1996.

Claire joined at 16, married at 17 and was pregnant at 19. She said Sea Organisation supervisors threatened strenuous physical work and repeated interrogations if she didn't end her pregnancy. She, too, was back at work the next day. Two years later she had a second abortion, this time while working for the church in Clearwater.

"I was desperate to not have to go through with (an abortion) some how, some way, but I did not have any means or options open to me financially or otherwise. If I did scream, they would take me back and I would be under a full-time security watch."

Sunny Pereira: Sea Organisation: Joined in 1988: Left in 2004: Abortions in 1994 and 2001.

"You just have a way of thinking," said Sunny Pereira, who was 15 when she entered the order. "It all has to do with the Sea Organisation and what we're trying to accomplish. Everything that is a distraction is scorned.... There's a lot of blaming myself. ... I got really depressed after the first one and still went through with the second one. That's something that I just still don't understand."

Samantha Domingo: Sea Organisation: Joined in 1989: Left in 1995: Abortion in 1993

"You get backed into a corner. . . . You're sitting in front of an ethics officer, you're sitting in front of (church) executives that are basically telling you you're a piece of s--- if you don't do this. You're bad. You let the group down. I felt like a bad person - I felt like I had murdered my child. It's not something that I would normally do and it's not something that sits easily on my conscience."

Gary Morehead: Sea Organisation: Joined 1990: Left 1997: The Scientology 'Security Chief' at the the church's heavily fenced and guarded, 500-acre desert compound near Hemet, California.

"the names of pregnant women came up, usually reported as having been 'successfully 'handled' (an abortion scheduled)". He has no records but estimated about one woman a month had an abortion, maybe 15 a year.

ALEXANDER JENTZSCH

After the July 3rd death of Alexander Jentzsch (the 27-year-old son Church of Scientology 'President' Heber Jentzsch), Alexander's mother, Karen de la Carriere, continues to search for answers about the days leading up to his death.

Shortly after Alexander's death, Karen was forwarded an e-mail that had been sent to Church of Scientology members describing a memorial service held on the Thursday following his death at Scientology's Hollywood 'Celebrity Centre' on Franklin Avenue. The e-mail was signed by 'Stan Gerson', a well-known Scientologist who had been Alexander's godfather.

Karen was barred from the event because she was excommunicated by Scientology in 2010 for daring to speak out publicly about the treatment of her ex-husband. She had been a 40-year member of the church and had studied directly under its founder, L. Ron Hubbard, but when she complained on a website about Heber's incarceration and that her son was growing up without a father, she was declared a 'Suppressive Person' and excommunicated from the church. Alexander, she says, was forced to 'disconnect' from her.

Alexander cut off all contact with her, and Karen did not see her son for the last two years of his life. His Scientologist wife prevented Karen from seeing her son's body before it was cremated, and she was told that the church planned no memorial. After considerable media attention, however, the church relented and quickly planned a memorial at the church's 'Celebrity Centre' in Hollywood.

On the Tuesday following Alexander's memorial at 'Celebrity Centre International', a description of the event was e-mailed to church members, and a copy found its way to Karen. According to the e-mail, Alexander's father, Heber Jentzsch, gave the eulogy at the service, which the e-mail described as 'an idyllic affair' - and seemed intended to counter growing media interest in the unusual circumstances surrounding Alexander's death:

Fired, broke and cut off from his mother and father, Alexander Jentzsch was in a tough spot on July 2nd. Had he turned to self-medicating himself with something stronger than prescription drugs and overdone it? If that's what happened, and the son of the 'President' of the Church of Scientology had died of a drug overdose while his father was incarcerated in a hellish church prison and his mother was untouchable as an excommunicant, Scientology had a real mess on its hands the morning of July 3rd in that Sylmar home.

Heber Jentzsch's presence at the memorial marks the first time that the church executive has reportedly been seen at a church event since about 2004. Multiple former Scientology officials say that Jentzsch has spent most or all of the intervening time as a prisoner in the church's notorious office-prison known as 'The Hole' at Scientology's international base near Hemet, California.

Ann Marie Tidman Broeker Logan passed away on June 14th, 2011. Annie was Scientology founder, L Ron Hubbard's closest friend and his exclusive direct personal and business aide during the last several years of his life.

Shortly before John Brousseau (JB) left the corporate church in April 2010, he was told that Annie had contracted lung cancer.

Members of Annie's family outside of the church phoned Annie and inquired about her health. On the few occasions since mid 2010 that they managed to be put through Annie denied having any health problems. Since June of 2011 no family had been able to reach her, instead they were rebuffed by corporate Scientology staff saying she could not be reached. A family member last called for Annie at the International Scientology base in Hemet California within two weeks of her death and was told "Annie can't talk to you now."

According to Marty Rathbun, a former church official, David Miscavige (the current leader of the Church of Scientology) covered up the death of Annie Tidman for more than half a year, after hiding her contraction of cancer for nearly two years and preventing anyone from outside his cult from speaking to, let alone questioning Annie prior to her death.

In 1992, while an executive of the church, operating under the orders of David Miscavige, Marty Rathbun intercepted Annie during her attempt to escape and reunite with her then-husband Jim Logan. Marty reported that they flew alone across the country overnight in John Travolta's private jet and once they had successfully prevented Annie from escaping, she returned with them to the International Scientology base. Marty stated that her reasons for returning were to "protect L. Ron Hubbard's legacy from David Miscavige".

Annie grew up in the monastic environment of the Church of Scientology's 'Sea Organisation' and, as a 2nd generation Scientologist, knew no other life. Her loyalty and dedication was fierce.

Robert Minton became a critic of Scientology after reading about its attacks on critics and internet free speech. He appeared on several news programs discussing his criticism of Scientology and the harassment from the church. This included a feature appearance on the June 16th, 1998 broadcast on the television news program 'Dateline NBC'. Later that year, he appeared in an A&E 'Investigative Reports' instalment called 'Inside Scientology' which aired that December.

Minton spent over \$10 million fighting Scientology. He also participated in demonstrations in front of the Boston Headquarters of the Church of Scientology near his Beacon Hill home.

After false reports by Scientology alleging fraud in his Nigerian businesses, Minton successfully sued two German Scientology entities and a Scientology spokeswoman for a permanent injunction, preventing them from repeating the libel. The decision was confirmed on appeal.

Minton founded the 'Lisa McPherson Trust' (LMT) in 1999, which brought a civil suit against the Church of Scientology for the wrongful death of Lisa McPherson and provided legal assistance to former Scientologists who alleged maltreatment or abuse by the church. The trust operated out of Clearwater, Florida, home to the church's 'Flag Land Base', Scientology's 'spiritual retreat'. Frequent confrontations between the LMT and Scientology began not long after the founding of the trust.

Minton changed his testimony in the McPherson case after a Scientology probe into his financial affairs. Minton was repeatedly ordered to attend depositions and questioned by Scientology lawyers about his alleged financial dealings. Years later former church members detailed how Scientology investigated Minton finding information he was "worried about". Critics of Scientology believe that Minton was blackmailed by the Church of Scientology.

In October 2009, former International church executives, Mike Rinder and Marty Rathbun told the 'St. Petersburg Times' that Scientology silenced Minton by digging into his financial details and secretly recording conversations.

Minton died in Clonbur, Ireland of a heart ailment on January 20th, 2010, at the age of 63. His funeral was held on the following Monday, at St. Mary of the Rosary Church, Cong, County Mayo, Ireland. He is buried in Lisloughrey Cemetery.

Actor Jim Carrey and his girlfriend Cathriona White were spotted in New York early in 2015, apparently having started dating again following a breakup. Shortly afterwards, the 30-year-old woman killed herself.

People magazine and other publications reported that Cathriona was an Irish citizen, had first started dating Carrey in 2012, worked as a make-up artist in the fashion industry, and was pronounced dead on a fatal Monday night. But what they didn't report, was that Cathriona was a Scientologist who took classes at the Hollywood Celebrity Centre, and was working on her Scientology 'Objectives' as part of the 'Survival Rundown' when she died.

Cathriona originally got involved in Scientology through members of musician Beck's circle of friends. She had gone to California from Ireland in 2009, and it is there that she met Beck's friends and began Scientology 'services'.

When Jim Carrey met her and they began dating in March 2012, her friends say, Carrey was aware that 'Cat' was a Scientologist.

Over the years, Carrey ridiculed Scientology numerous times which would have undoubtedly have caused problems for the devout follower; Cathriona would have been forced to 'disconnect' from or 'handle' any persons antagonistic to her 'religion' as a matter of Scientology church policy.

After they began dating in 2012, Carrey and White reportedly soon broke up, but then were spotted early 2015 in New York after they began seeing each other again.

Cathriona's friends say that they were concerned about Cat dating Carrey again, but they were assured by Scientologists they knew that Cat was emotionally prepared for the challenge of dating Carrey because, they said,

"She has just finished the "Purification Rundown!" - a process invented by Scientology founder L. Ron Hubbard that he claimed could 'detoxify' the body through an intense regimen of daily sauna sessions and massive doses of the vitamin niacin.

"I am shocked and deeply saddened by the passing of my sweet Cathriona," Carrey said in a statement. He called White "a truly kind and delicate Irish flower, too sensitive for this soil, to whom loving and being loved was all that sparkled."

In June, 2009, 'Kung Fu' and 'Kill Bill' actor David Carradine was found dead in a Bangkok hotel room

A Thailand newspaper, 'The Nation', reported the 72-year-old actor was found hanging.

Chuck Binder, Carradine's manager, said the actor was staying in the Thai capital while shooting a movie called 'Stretch'. When a producer went to his luxury hotel room, where he discovered the actor's body.

Carradine had been staying at the hotel since Tuesday, June 2nd but could not be contacted after he failed to appear for a meal with the rest of the film crew on Wednesday. His body was later found by a hotel maid at 10am on Thursday morning. A preliminary police investigation found that he had hung himself with a cord used with the room's curtains. He had been dead at least 12 hours and there was no sign that he had been assaulted. A police officer at Bangkok's Lumpini precinct station would not confirm the identity of the dead man to The Associated Press, but said the luxury Swissotel 'Nai Lert Park Hotel' had reported that a male guest killed himself there.

Binder called the death "shocking and sad ... He was full of life, always wanting to work ... a great person." The actor is survived by his wife Annie Bierman and three children.

Carradine was best known for his role as Kwai Chang Caine, a Shaolin priest traveling the 1800s American frontier West in the TV series 'Kung Fu', which aired in 1972-75.

After his death, Carradine's third ex-wife, Gail Jensen, revealed the actor's connection to the controversial Church of Scientology, and how his 'unique' lifestyle may have been too much for the 'teetotaling organisation'. Jensen told RadarOnline.com that the church couldn't handle David's 'rebellion'.

"He loved to smoke, drink and was always late. They told him 'you just don't fit with our traditions.'"

Carradine's desire to be accepted by Scientology may have been for sentimental reasons. According to Jensen, Carradine had several 'Scientologist' friends and credited landing his role in Kill Bill to having met director Quentin Tarantino at the Church of Scientology's 'Celebrity Centre' in Hollywood. In a 2004 interview, Carradine talked candidly about his past boozing and narcotics use, saying,


"You're probably witnessing the last time I will ever answer those questions. Because this is a regeneration. It is a renaissance. It is the start of a new career for me. It's time to do nothing but look forward."

EDWARD McBRIDE

The 110,000-volt electric charge that killed Edward McBride was so strong it caused an explosion capable of causing flash burns up to 10 metres away. Witnesses who saw it at the Energex substation in Everton, in Brisbane's north, likened it to fireworks that glowed red long after the Australian soldier's life had ended.

There could be no doubt the 30-year-old Special Forces commando and trained electrician wanted to die, of that fact State Coroner John Lock could be sure.

Less certain, though, is what prompted this sudden, violent end, so close to the beginning of Mr McBride's new life away from the army. Questions also remain about what, if anything, the Church of Scientology knew about his fatal decision.

An inquest into his February 7th, 2007 death raised more questions than it answered. In a 31-page interim report, released ahead of an army Commission of Inquiry, Mr Lock expressed frustration at the Church of Scientology and its Sydney leaders, who spirited away secret files on Mr McBride to the church's US headquarters in defiance of a Queensland Police warrant for their seizure.

The coroner also dismissed as 'selective' evidence given to the hearings by a spiritual counsellor, known in Scientology parlance as an 'auditor', who had led Mr McBride through an intensive course designed to help followers face distressing issues from their past.

"I have no idea as to what is on these files and it may be something completely innocuous," Mr Lock wrote in his findings, "however, the fact of the matter remains that Mr McBride's attitude changed some time after the afternoon of February 5th, 2007 and these files may very well have had some information which could give the inquest some assistance in determining what happened.

Edward Alexander McBride was born in Belfast, Northern Ireland, the middle of three sons. He grew up in Perth, where he trained as an electrician and represented the state in martial arts before taking his rite of passage and travelling through Europe, the Middle East and South-East Asia at the age of 21.

He had joined the church in Sydney around the time he became injured and had considered becoming a Scientology auditor himself once his army discharge was finalised. In August 2006 he took out a \$20,000 bank loan to complete three Scientology counselling services called: 'The Drug Rundown', 'The Happiness Rundown' and 'ARC Straight Wire'.

In deference to the military Commission of Inquiry, Mr Lock refrained from handing down his full coronial findings, and perhaps too his theory on what led to Mr McBride's demise. But he left the door open for Church of Scientology leaders to offer up Mr McBride's counselling files that may be the key to solving this mystery for his grieving family.

On October 25th, 2011, Thirty two year old Gabriel Graves complained of a terrible headache, a worsening continuation of the one from the day before. It started after he began going into the sauna - part of the Church of Scientology's 'Narconon' drug program he'd gone to in order to get help with his addiction. He had been sweating for hours a day after taking the daily increasing amounts of vitamins - the combination of which, according to the materials he was made to study, were to remove drugs and toxins from his body. He complained about his headaches and his pain, and asked for pain relief but was denied any each time. Instead, he was told to 'get back into the sauna'. The program staff refused to help Gabriel any further.

The next morning, October 26th, there was a commotion a few doors down the hallway from where a student named 'Joe' (real name withheld) roomed. 'Joe' heard someone yell "I am not a doctor!" He looked out into the hallway and noticed this came from two doors down the hall, from the room Gabriel and his roommate had been assigned. Joe saw the 'nurse' of the facility crying as she walked out of Gabriel's room with another staffer, and heard someone say that Gabriel had been found dead in his bed. All students were made to go outside and stay gathered around the building while the Narconon staff members mustered in the lobby.

One of the students said that Gabriel was found dead around 8am. 'Joe' remembers being back in his room at around 10am when he heard the commotion in the hall. It appears that the authorities were not contacted until about 11 am, after the staff meeting in the lobby. Even then, the ambulance and a policeman, in a Dodge Charger, did not arrive until just before noon.

Gabriel was a beloved father of two young girls and a cherished son and brother. He was very artistic and loved playing music, writing poetry and sketching.

“Cause of death for Narconon Arrowhead patient unknown”. The state Medical Examiner's Office could not determine what caused the April death of a woman at a detoxification facility rooted in Scientology.

Hillary Ann Holten, 21, of Carrollton, Texas, died April 11th, 2012 at the Church of Scientology's 'drug rehabilitation' facility 'Narconon Arrowhead', which is on Lake Eufaula northeast of McAlester. Holten's death was one of three deaths at 'Narconon Arrowhead', triggering a multiagency investigation.

Gabriel Graves, 32, of Claremore died Oct. 26th, 2011, and Stacy Murphy, 20, of Owasso died July 19th, 2012. Graves' and Holten's manner and cause of death were listed as 'unknown' by the Medical Examiner's Office. Murphy's autopsy report had yet to be completed at the time.

Holten's autopsy showed nothing unusual except some lesions on her face and bruises on her arms and right leg, according to the report. Her toxicology report showed no positive results for any tested substance.

According to a lawsuit filed by Holten's family, Hillary had congenital adrenal hyperplasia - the lack of an enzyme which the adrenal gland needs to make certain hormones and was creating too much of another hormone that was being treated with medication. The lawsuit alleged negligence by the Narconon organisation for accepting Holten into its program given her medical condition, and for not providing her with proper medical treatment.

The autopsy report was inconclusive about the possibility that her death was associated with the medical condition.

As a result of these three deaths, Narconon Arrowhead was investigated by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the Pittsburg County Sheriff's Office and the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

It's tragic enough that singer-songwriter Isaac Hayes was found dead next to his treadmill in August 2008 at the age of 65, but according to an article by Roger Friedman on Fox News.com, Scientology may have played a role in the singer's death – which was ruled the result of a stroke.

In March 2006, Hayes very publicly asked to be let out of his 'South Park' contract right before the re-airing of the controversial Tom Cruise-Scientology 'Trapped in the Closet' episode due to the series' "inappropriate ridicule of religious communities".

"There is a place in this world for satire," Hayes said in a statement, "but there is a time when satire ends and intolerance and bigotry towards religious beliefs of others begins."

Many in the media speculated Scientology was behind Isaac's departure from the show and its co-creator Matt Stone seemed to confirm their suspicions when he told Friedman that,

"(Hayes) was under great pressure from Scientology, and said that if we didn't stop poking at them, he would have to leave." Friedman speculated that Scientology had something to do with Isaacs' departure from this life.

Isaac was in trouble. Having lost the rights to his songs two decades earlier, he was finally making some money voicing the character of 'Chef' on 'South Park'. But South Park lampooned Scientology, so its leaders wanted Isaac out.

Push came to shove on Nov. 16th, 2005, when South Park aired its hilarious 'Trapped in the Closet' episode, spoofing celebrity Scientologists Tom Cruise and John Travolta. South Park creator Matt Stone said later that Isaac had gone to him in tears,

"He said he was under great pressure from Scientology, and if we didn't stop poking at them, he'd have to leave," Stone said.

The conversation ended there. Isaac performed Chef's signature song at the Blues Ball a week later with great delight. Although he was devoted to Scientology, he also loved being part of South Park. He was proud of it. And, more importantly, it gave him income he badly needed.

In March 2006, news came that Hayes was resigning from South Park. Isaac was in no position to have quit anything due to his stroke, but the Church of Scientology issued a statement to the press saying that Hayes had resigned, and the press just ate it up. No one spoke to Isaac directly, because he couldn't literally speak. Chef was written out of the show.

When Theresa Duncan, 40, took her own life on July 10th, followed a week later by her boyfriend, Jeremy Blake, 35, their friends were stunned and the press was fascinated: what had destroyed this glamorous couple, stars of New York's multi-media art world, still madly in love with each other after 12 years?

On a rainy October night in Washington, D.C., the friends and family of Jeremy Blake gathered for a private memorial service at the Corcoran Gallery of Art. Blake ended his life on the night of July 17th, after leaving the 'Rockstar' offices, on lower Broadway. He took a train all the way out to Rockaway Beach, the birthplace of his mother. Around 8pm, an unidentified woman called 911 saying she had seen a man of Blake's description walking naked into the water. It was the last in a series of heroic gestures he made for the 'lovely Theresa'.

"I am going to join the lovely Theresa," Blake, had written on the back of a business card which he left on the beach, along with his clothes. Police helicopters searched for him for days on the chance he might still be alive, then on July 22nd, a fisherman found his body floating 4.5 miles off Sea Girt, New Jersey.

'The lovely Theresa' was Theresa Duncan, a writer, filmmaker, computer-game creator, and Blake's girlfriend of 12 years. He had found her lifeless body on July 10th, in the rectory of St. Mark's Church in Manhattan's East Village, where the couple had been renting an apartment. There was a bowl full of 'Benadryl' pills, a bottle of 'Tylenol PM', and a champagne glass on the nightstand with a note saying, "I love all of you."

"They were remarkable people," said David Ross, former director of the San Francisco 'Museum of Modern Art'. "I can't think of one without the other. It was flattering to be in their presence. You felt good that they liked you."

"In the summer of 2006, I saw my brother for the first time in years," said Blake's 18-year-old sister, Adrienne, crying, "and I could tell he was completely different from what he had been. It frightened me."

In their final days in New York, Blake and Duncan would seek refuge from the demons they believed were chasing them in the company of radical Episcopalian priest, Frank Morales, who had become one of their closest friends and confidants. Morales knew they had had some trouble in Los Angeles, but he never knew the full extent of it, only that they believed the Church of Scientology was harassing them and that they were afraid. "You're safe here," he told them.

Blake wrote of how he and Theresa had been harassed to the point of absurdity by people who were so paranoid that it made him laugh. He said that they had been defamed by 'crazy Scientologists', and threatened and followed by their 'thugs'.

The Church of Scientology has denied any knowledge of the couple.

In February, 2014, a flattering interview with John Travolta showed up in 'The Telegraph' in advance of the actor's appearance that weekend in London. Media outlets made much of one statement Travolta made in the piece about how he coped after the 2009 death of his son Jett...

"I don't know what I would have done if I hadn't had the support of Scientology. I don't think I could have got through it. They were with me every day after Jett died. They even travelled with me when I needed to get away. And for a solid two years it was like that. It was only in the second year that I started to take a break of a day or two just to see how I was doing on my own."

If Travolta intended for that to make Scientology look beneficial, it had the opposite effect. He seemed to indicate that church handlers were watching him so closely for more than a year, that at some point he needed to get away.

On New Year's Day, 2009, The Travoltas had a lazy morning before an afternoon boat ride. When they returned, John said good night to his son at about 6pm and Jett retired to his bedroom. The next day he was found dead.

The police report states that Jeff Kathrein informed them he had been watching television in the suite next to Jett's and that he last saw the boy at about 11.30pm. According to the police, Jett may have been left unattended for more than ten hours.

"We had been told he had fallen, hit his head and had a fit and was unconscious. The doctor told me he thought he'd had something like an epileptic fit and that he had a history of seizures", reported paramedic, Marcus Garvey, "John and Kelly were standing over him like they were in a daze. John was shaking. Kelly was crying and trying to comfort him."

Jett was worked on for 25 minutes at the scene. Later, as paramedics loaded him into an ambulance, they asked the Travoltas to follow. At the hospital, Jett was put on life support while his parents waited in an anteroom. When all attempts to revive him failed, the body was moved to the hospital morgue where Kelly and John said their goodbyes.

Intriguing questions have since been raised about the wedding photographer who was the main carer for John Travolta's son - devout Scientologist, Jeff Kathrein, a man who caused raised eyebrows a few years ago when he was seen being kissed on the lips and hugged by Travolta on the steps of a private plane.

Kaja Bordevich Ballo died March 28th, 2008, while a university student in the French town of Nice. Her father was Olav Gunnar Ballo, a member of the Norwegian Parliament. Her stepmother was Heidi Sørensen, a former member of the Norwegian Parliament, and State Secretary for the Ministry of the Environment. On March 28th, 2008 Kaja Ballo took the personality test used as a recruitment tool the Church of Scientology, and subsequently committed suicide. Family and friends stated that Ballo was happy prior to taking the test, and that her mood dramatically shifted after receiving the results. Kaja committed suicide only hours after getting the results of the test back, jumping from the fourth floor of her dorm room. In addition to a note, her family found the Scientology personality test among her belongings. French police investigated connections between Scientology and Ballo's death, and interviewed two leaders of the organisation in France. Prosecutors stated in December 2008 that they were unable to establish a causative link between the Scientology test and Ballo's death.

The incident received significant media coverage in Norway, with 'Verdens Gang' and 'Dagbladet' devoting multiple cover stories to investigating the controversy. Norway parliament member, Inga Marte Thorkildsen commented that she thought indications were that Scientology had a role in Ballo's suicide. "All indications are that the Scientologist sect has played a direct role in Kaja's choice to take her own life." she said.

Psychologist, Rudy Myrvang told 'Aftenposten' that Scientology's personality test was designed to break down an individual; he characterized the test as a form of recruitment tool for the organisation.

Scientology critic Andreas Heldal-Lund stated parents of those involved in Scientology had contacted him with similar concerns. The Norwegian Psychological Association warned individuals against taking such types of personality tests.

Ballo's father wrote a book about his daughter's death, and refrained from interviews with the press until the book was published in 2009. Titled 'Kaja: 1988 – 2008', the book became a bestseller in Norway, reaching second place on the bestseller list of the 'Bestseller Association' in Norway for general literature in May 2009. Olav Gunnar Ballo stated that he wrote the book as an expository method to both process his grief, inform his family about the controversy, and educate the public about suicide.

Kaja Ballo took a personality test given by the Church of Scientology in Nice, France on March 28th, 2008. The test is known either as the Scientology personality test, or as Oxford Capacity Analysis test.

Ballo's friend and study partner Henry Møinichen told Dagbladet, "I think Kaja would be alive today if she had not gone to the Scientologists."

The 2009 death of 28-year-old Kaysie Dianne Wernick, who was transferred from the Church of Scientology's 'drug rehabilitation' facility 'Narconon Arrowhead' to a nearby hospital while suffering a respiratory infection, resulted in an out-of-court settlement of a civil negligence lawsuit, the terms of which have not been disclosed. There was a rash of other deaths at the Narconon facility beginning in 1995 and after looking at the earlier reports and additional witness statements, Assistant District Attorney, Richard Hull, at the the District Attorney's Office Oklahoma, asked the Sheriff's Office to deepen its already ongoing investigation into the July, 19th 2012 death of 20-year-old Stacy Murphy, the April 11th 2012 death of 21 year old Hillary Holten and the October 25th, 2011 death of 32-year-old Gabriel Graves.

Kaysie died on March 3rd, 2009 of 'double pneumonia'. She was born Feb, 18th, 1981, in St. Augustine, Florida and lived there most of her life. She had just turned 28 years old.

Kaysie was a loving daughter, sister, aunt and friend. She was a member of the St. Augustine Church of Christ and a talented athlete, excelling in volleyball and gymnastics. One of her greatest loves was the beach and surfing.

Kyle died from a gunshot wound to the head on Friday, February 16th, 2007. The time of death was estimated to be 11:00pm. He was staying with his Scientologist father, Tom Brennan when the incident occurred, in Clearwater, Florida.

Despite anomalies in the investigation, and what has been alleged the blocking of evidence, the cause of death was ruled as suicide.

Kyle suffered from depression and was taking Lexapro to alleviate the symptoms. The practice of taking psychiatric drugs goes against one of the core belief systems of Scientology. His father had moved away from the family home several years previously and originally moved to West Tampa to join the local Scientology Organisation and undergo 'training'.

Within a few months of joining the 'church' he became acquainted with one of Scientology's more infamous members, Denise Miscavige Gentile, the twin sister of Scientology leader David Miscavige.

In May 2006 Gentile became Brennan's Scientology 'auditor'/'chaplain' and from there, Brennan's commitment to the Organisation was devout.

Kyle's body was found on the floor of his father's bedroom. In Kyle's bedroom, the bedding was stripped and for some unexplained reason, Kyle's bags were packed even though, according to his father, he was due to be staying at the apartment for a number of weeks. Tom Brennan's .357 Magnum was found near Kyle's body, however Forensic Specialist Jennifer McCabe did not find the bullet that killed Kyle and Kyle's fingerprints were nowhere to be found on over 14 separate pieces of evidence at the scene including the weapon and 10 rounds of ammunition. Initially, Kyle's laptop could not be located because it had been removed from the apartment before the police arrived. Weeks later Tom Brennan returned Kyle's laptop to the family, all the documentation had been deleted. Finally, none of the prescribed drugs that Kyle used to control the symptoms of his depression were found at the apartment; Denise Miscavige Gentile and her husband had persuaded Kyle Brennan's father to take away his Lexapro.


Around 3:00pm on the afternoon after Kyle's death, Clearwater Police Department Detective Stephen Bohling began his investigation. Three determining pieces of evidence were absent from the investigation. Without fingerprints, without the bullet, and without a confirmed GSR test it should have been impossible to determine whether Kyle's death was a suicide or a homicide. However, this did not stop Detective Bohling from declaring Kyle's suspicious death a suicide.

Medical Examiner, Marti Scholl said that she had declared Kyle Brennan's death a suicide because she had been informed that there was a suicide note (by the police). Detective Bohling, under oath, later stated that there was no such suicide note.

Lisa McPherson, Born February 10th, 1959 Dallas, Texas, died aged 36 in Clearwater, Florida.

Lisa was an American member of the Church of Scientology who died of a pulmonary embolism while under the care of the Church of Scientology's 'Flag Service Organization'. Following the report of the state of Florida's medical examiner that indicated that Lisa was a victim of negligent homicide, the Church of Scientology was indicted on two felony charges, 'abuse and/or neglect of a disabled adult' and 'practicing medicine without a license'. The charges against the Church of Scientology were dropped after the state's medical examiner suddenly changed the cause of death from 'undetermined' to an 'accident' on June 13th, 2000. A civil suit brought by her family against the Church was settled May 28th, 2004.

In 1994, Lisa, who became a Scientology adherent at age 18, moved from Dallas, Texas, to Clearwater, Florida, with her employer, 'AMC Publishing', which was at that time owned by Scientologist Bennetta Slaughter and operated and staffed primarily by Scientologists. In June 1995, the church placed Lisa on an 'Introspection Rundown' due to perceived mental instability. Lisa completed the Rundown, and she attested to having achieved Scientology's 'State of Clear' in September, 1995.

On November 18th, 1995, McPherson was involved in a minor car accident. Paramedics initially left her alone because she was ambulatory, but after she began to remove her clothes, they decided to take her to the hospital. Following intervention by fellow Scientologists, Lisa refused psychiatric observation or admission to the hospital and checked herself out against medical advice after a short evaluation.


Lisa was then taken to the Scientology base for 'rest and relaxation' according to the Church of Scientology, but sworn statements exist testifying that Lisa was taken there to undergo another 'Introspection Rundown'.

Mark McGarry, an attorney with the Florida Office of the State Attorney, characterised Lisa's stay at the church's 'Fort Harrison Hotel' as an 'Isolation Watch'. The church kept a 24 hour watch over Lisa, keeping detailed logs. The logs for the last three days were summarised from the originals and according to former church executive, Marty Rathbun, the originals were shredded by Church of Scientology officials in order to hide crucial evidence.

On January 21st, 1997, Wood appeared on the television show 'Inside Edition' and stated that the autopsy showed McPherson's condition had deteriorated slowly, that she had gone without fluids for five to ten days, was underweight, had cockroach bites and was comatose from 24 to 48 hours before she died.

Under pressure from the church of Scientology's legal department, Wood later changed the cause of death from 'undetermined' to an 'accident', tracing Lisa's pulmonary embolism to her psychosis and a minor auto accident as major factors. Wood's sudden about-face caused a review and dismissal of the criminal case.

By all appearances, Noah Lottick of Kingston, Pa., had been a normal, happy 24-year-old who was looking for his place in the world. On the last day in June, 1990 when his parents drove to New York City to collect his lifeless body, they were nearly catatonic with grief.

This young Russian-studies scholar had jumped from a 10th-floor window of the 'Milford Plaza Hotel' and bounced off the hood of a stretch limousine. When the police arrived, his fingers were still clutching \$171 in cash; virtually the only money he hadn't turned over to the Church of Scientology, the self-help 'philosophy' group he had discovered just seven months earlier.

Noah's death inspired his father Edward, a physician, to start his own investigation into the church.

"We thought Scientology was something like Dale Carnegie," Lottick said. "I now believe it's a school for psychopaths. Their so-called therapies are manipulations. They take the best and the brightest people and destroy them." The Lotticks wanted to sue the church for contributing to their son's death, but the prospect had them frightened. For nearly 40 years, the big business of Scientology has shielded itself exquisitely behind the First Amendment as well as a battery of high-priced criminal lawyers and shady private detectives.

Noah's story was featured in the May 6th, 1991 'Time Magazine' article 'Scientology The Thriving Cult of Greed and Power'.

QUENTIN HUBBARD

Geoffrey Quentin McCaully Hubbard (January 6th, 1954 – November 12th, 1976), was the son of Scientology founder L. Ron Hubbard and his third wife, Mary Sue Hubbard. He died at the age of 22 of an apparent suicide.

After Ron's eldest son Ron Jr. quit Scientology in 1959, Hubbard chose Quentin to be his successor and lead the organisation. Quentin went to sea with Hubbard to establish it's quasi-paramilitary arm 'the Sea Organisation', living on the flagship Apollo and reaching the highest levels of Scientology training. He disagreed with his father's plans for him however, sometimes saying that he wanted to be a pilot, and in 1974 said that he would like to be a dancer. Soon after this, a friend found him in the midst of a suicide attempt. Quentin survived this attempt and was assigned to the church's in-house prison camp, the 'Rehabilitation Project Force'.

Former Scientologists have said that Quentin was homosexual, and that this clearly caused him a great deal of personal torment as Scientology doctrine classifies homosexuals as 'sexual perverts' stating they are 'quite ill physically'. Another source close to Quentin, claimed that rumours of his homosexuality were due to him sometimes claiming to be that way in order to discourage women who were interested in him to protect them from the consequences of his father's disapproval. Quentin is described as having had a gentle demeanour, with 'none of his father's bombast'.

In 1975 the Sea Organisation moved ashore to Clearwater, Florida. Quentin was assigned to operations there but was often absent. Police discovered him unconscious in his car in Las Vegas on October 28th, 1976, without any identifying documents. L. Ron Hubbard was furious at the news, shouting, "That stupid fucking kid! Look what he's done to me!" Quentin died two weeks later without having regained consciousness.

Although there had been a hose from the car's window to the tailpipe, a test for carbon monoxide was negative. Mrs. Hubbard told Scientologists that Quentin had died from encephalitis. L. Ron Hubbard is said to have deteriorated rapidly after Quentin's death, becoming dishevelled and increasingly paranoid.

The Church of Scientology has never attempted to discredit Quentin (as was the case with Ron Jr.), but has maintained a complete silence around the subject of Quentin and does not make any mention of him in any of their publications or on their websites.

Shawn Lonsdale (1969 – February 16th, 2008) was a videographer and prominent critic of the Church of Scientology. He resided in Clearwater, Florida, and regularly videotaped members of Scientology coming and going from church activities in Clearwater. Shawn had initially intended to do a photography project on homeless people in Clearwater, but after an experience at a City Council meeting, he began to research Scientology instead. Shawn got into an argument with a Scientologist at the City Council meeting, and the Scientologist followed him home. The next day Shawn observed a van waiting for two hours outside his home. After researching the Church of Scientology on critical websites, he decided to expose information about the organisation. He established a website, and filmed video footage of Scientologists going about activities in Clearwater, and aired edited footage on a local Public-access television cable TV station. At one point, Shawn got into a physical altercation with a Scientologist while filming. The Scientologist was arrested and charged with misdemeanor battery, but was later released and the charges were dropped.

The Church of Scientology hired private investigators and discovered a criminal record on Shawn, which was subsequently publicised by a Scientologist on fliers and on a website. Lonsdale was subpoenaed by the Church of Scientology in 2006, where he was accused of being affiliated with the Lisa McPherson Trust, a group critical of Scientology which was restricted in where it could protest in Clearwater.

Shawn died suddenly on February 16th, 2008, and a Clearwater police spokeswoman stated that the death appeared to be due to suicide.

In May 2007, Lonsdale appeared on the BBC 'Panorama' exposé 'Scientology and Me', and was interviewed about his experiences as a critic of Scientology by British journalist John Sweeney. When Sweeney asked Shawn why the Church of Scientology was publicising derogatory Things about him, he replied:

"They are trying to embarrass me. They try to paint you as crazy, so that no one will listen to you". During their interview, Church of Scientology Spokesman, Tommy Davis arrived, opened a folder, and began to read Shawn's criminal record out loud. Later in the program, Sweeney was accused by Davis of giving "convicted sexual pervert Shawn Lonsdale" a "soft interview". Sweeney yelled at Davis and lost his temper, resulting in both men shouting at each other back and forth. A Scientology-produced video of the incident was uploaded by a Scientology agent onto YouTube in an attempt to discredit John Sweeney. However, the 'exploding tomato' incident depicting John Sweeney screaming at the arrogant church spokesman went viral on the internet, where it was viewed over 856,000 times prior to the airing of John Sweeney's show, helping to promote the very documentary the church was fighting so hard to prevent being aired in the first place.

"When alive a Scientology spokesman said of him: 'He has no redeeming value to anyone, anywhere". Well, he was a bit of a hero to me ... I for one mourn the loss of a brave and singular American" - John Sweeney

An Owasso man whose daughter died of an apparent drug overdose while at a drug treatment facility says he wants the place fixed or shut down and he wants the world to know about Narconon's roots in the Church of Scientology and what that organisation's beliefs entail.

Robert Murphy's daughter, Stacy Dawn Murphy, died at the Church of Scientology's 'drug rehabilitation' centre 'Narconon Arrowhead', July 19th, 2012.

"The facility claims it has medical personnel 'on staff' 24 hours a day but what they don't say is that 'on staff' does not mean 'on site', Murphy says. "You believe they have a 24-hour physician in the building and all these nurses in the building - that's what you hear when they say they have a 24-hour staff. Well in actuality they have 'em on staff, but they're not on the premises!"

Stacy's death was listed as 'unattended', backing up Robert Murphy's contention that his daughter was left in a room alone where she passed away from what appears to have been a drug overdose. The 'on staff' medical personnel were apparently never notified. "They had her for ten-plus hours where they knew she was in an OD (overdose) situation and nobody did anything. No monitoring of her, no physician was called, no 911, didn't call her parents, nothing. Just put her in a room and left her to die", said her father.

Prior to Stacy's admission to Narconon Arrowhead, her family had been desperate for help and Narconon boasts an incredible 76 percent success rate, roughly three times the success rate of traditional treatment programs. "It sounds so appealing, a 76 percent success rate," said Stacy's father, "but in reality there's no clinical study to back it up." Unfortunately, Stacy's parents didn't know that at the time and they decided on Narconon despite the extremely high cost. "You're drawn to this '76 percent' and you're willing to believe it. You think you're getting more by paying more...what parent wouldn't pay whatever it takes to get results that work?" Murphy asks, rhetorically.

Then, even as the shock of her death set in, Robert began taking a closer look at Narconon's underlying roots in the Church of Scientology. He hadn't really looked at the connection before Stacy's death. "They hide it so well, you don't ask about because you're still stuck on the fact you're still thinking '76 percent success rate.' So you don't question 'is it Scientology?' it's just a book that they use."

Now, Robert Murphy says, he has a much darker opinion of Scientology and believes the so-called 'church' uses Narconon merely to gain followers and their money.

One of the earliest of the many suspicious deaths in Scientology is that of Susan Meister. In February, 1971 she joined the Church of Scientology's monastic order, the 'Sea Organisation', signing its infamous billion year contract. She died onboard Scientology founder L. Ron Hubbard's flagship 'Apollo', just a few months later, on June 5th, 1971 of a bullet wound to the forehead, which the Church of Scientology claimed was self inflicted.

Her body was left in Morocco where her father had to go to pick it up himself. Meanwhile a suicide note appeared, but the authorities could not read it, and Susan's cabin had been cleared of all other papers, diaries etc by Scientology founder's wife, Mary Sue Hubbard, who wrote a report for the Moroccan police (it is unlikely that the Moroccan police could read a word of the report).

George Meister, dazed by the news, decided to go to Morocco to try and verify the circumstances of his daughter's death. He was told he would be able to see his daughter's body in the morgue in Safi. Church official, Norman Starkey, offered to pay for a 'Christian burial' for Susan in Morocco, but "regretted" that the church would not be paying for her body to be returned to the United States. He left for Morocco on July 14th and was met at the airport in Casablanca by Church of Scientology 'Sea Organisation' member, Peter Warren.

Meister was taken aboard the flagship Apollo and shown a photograph of his dead daughter. "Susan was lying on a bunk, wearing the new dress her mother had made for her" said her father, "her arms crossed with a long barrelled revolver on her breast. A bullet hole was in the centre of her forehead and blood was running out of the corners of her mouth. I began to wonder how Susan could possibly shoot herself in the centre of her forehead with the long barrelled revolver. She would have had to hold it with both hands at arms length. There were no powder burns on her forehead, which certainly would have been the case if the gun was against her forehead". The gun was not available for inspection.



Meister asked Warren if he could speak with L. Ron Hubbard who was onboard the Apollo at the time. He knew that Hubbard's daughter, Diana, was about Susan's age. Hubbard declined to see him.

After his return to the US, Meister found out that Susan had been buried in a Casablanca cemetery wrapped in a burlap sack. He arranged to have her body exhumed and shipped back to the US in a sealed tin coffin.

After his daughter's death, Meister received anonymous letters saying that his daughter had made pornographic films, and that she had been a drug addict. The harassment continued for six years and stopped around the time of the FBI raids on the Church of Scientology's mafia-style 'Guardian's Office', in the Summer of 1977.

















It is important for me, Victoria Britton—the mother of Kyle Thomas Brennan—to let all of the caring and concerned people know the truth regarding his life and death. Kyle was baptized into the Catholic faith at three months old and was eternally laid to rest as a Catholic on February 22, 2007.

The statement that my son died for Tom Cruise’s Scientology beliefs is completely false. Kyle never practiced, adhered to, or believed in the doctrine of Scientology. He was sent literature from the cult by his father, an avid member of the so-called church located in Clearwater, Florida. I am refraining from using the many negative adjectives that Kyle used to describe their beliefs after reading the literature sent him, but absurd and ludicrous were two of his favorites.

I am uncertain as to what unfortunate events led to the tragic death of my dear son, who at the time was staying with his Scientologist father. I can say that his depression medication was not found on his person when the police searched the crime scene. I was also informed that when Kyle’s father found him he waited forty-five minutes before calling for medical assistance. He called a fellow Scientologist first, and then waited for him to arrive on the scene before calling an ambulance or the police. The thought of this inhuman behavior will haunt me for the rest of my life.

There are no words to describe how a mother feels when she has lost a child. In many ways, I am able to cope by pretending he is still with us. Whenever I see a group of college-age young men, I look for my son’s face among them hoping to find him. He looks back at me with his beautiful blue eyes. He’s smiling . . . and he’s wearing his favorite blue shirt.
